







International Summer School Scholarship

June 27 – August 5, 2022 University of Oslo, Norway



The GRSP scholarship application for International Summer School at the University of Oslo for summer 2022 is open. The scholarship includes students from all over the world in a diverse cultural program in the beautiful city of Oslo, Norway with the intention of six weeks of academic achievement and international good will.

- Application Deadline: January 20, 2022 through GRSP website. Nominees will be reviewed and winners will be selected by a committee of GRSP Trustees in each District. Once selected (by February 2022), the student will then apply to the summer school.
- Oslo, Norway is a small country in Northern Europe with beautiful and breathtaking scenery, a fascinating history and culture and a thriving economy.
- English is one of the two languages of instruction.
- Complete 12-credit hours of undergraduate coursework, looking at such diverse topics as sustainability, the welfare state, history, film, politics, etc. from a comparative perspective, with Norway as a case study. Graduate students take one course during the International Summer School. For a list of academic disciplines, visit link below.
- Course format has not been announced (in-person and/or online) as determined by government regulations.
- Program is 76 years old with a successful experience that allows students to engage with and learn from fellow students from nearly 100 countries, building cross-cultural understanding and confidence.
- Visit for one week with Norwegian Rotary host families.

Scholarship Details

Open to undergraduate and graduate college students who have completed sophomore year, ages 20-24, single, in good health and academic standing plus willing to serve as an ambassador for Georgia Rotarians. Scholarship includes air fares from Atlanta-Oslo and return to Atlanta, one weekend excursion (administered by the University of Oslo), room, board and administrative fees for the International Summer School at the University of Oslo. Scholarship recipients must pay their travel expense to and from Atlanta, plus provide their own personal spending money.
